- Access to reviewers' comments and evaluation average.
- Waiving the registration fee of effective invited session organizers.

- Publication of best papers in the Journal of Systemics, Cybernetics, and Informatics (JSCI), which is indexed in EBSCO, Cabell, DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals), and Google Scholar, and listed in Cabell Directory of Publishing Opportunities and in Ulrich's Periodical Directory.
