

# Applied Representational Analysis

## Second Essay

There may be no news that is absolutely objective and free of bias, considering that human beings write it, but most people agree that news should be fact based and accurate. With the second draft, you were asked to examine a related series of fake news stories. In this draft you should extend that argument (or begin a new one, if your articles weren't optimal) about the ideology at play in the fake news stories you analyze.

This time, I ask that you also find a news story on the same or similar topic that is *demonstrably more reliable*. Articulate and why how this article differs from the fake news articles.

The argument that you have to make about fake news you analyze should be summarized in the essay's thesis.

There should be both in-text citation and a complete Works Cited page.
