Staff Spotlight: Meet Dr. Mark Bernards!

Dr. Mark Bernards grew up in the town of Spanish Fork, Utah, which was strongly influenced by ag. His interest in plants was inspired by his father who always grew a large garden and had many fruit trees. Dr. Bernards earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees in Agronomy from Brigham Young University and Ph.D in Crop and Soil Sciences from Michigan State University. After college his first permanent job was as the "Irrigated Weed Specialist" at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and his title was later changed to Extension Weed Specialist. Dr. Bernards started at WIU on June 20, 2011 as an Associate Professor of Agronomy. At WIU he also advises the Agronomy Club, coaches the Weeds Team, as well as manages the agronomy operations at the AFL and Kerr farms. Each year he conducts 25-30 research protocols and also put out 8-10 protocols that are used for teaching labs in the fall semester. Dr. Bernards thoroughly enjoys teaching and working with WIU students and the relationships that are built as they learn together. In his free time, Dr. Bernards enjoys spending time with his wife Alysson, who is an excellent soccer coach, and their five children. He also enjoys working on projects around the home and yard as well as playing the piano and organ. Dr. Bernards is also very involved with his church congregation by being an active scout leader, playing the organ for worship twice a month, and giving a sermon once a month.

Farm and Location: Ash Grove Farm, Hampton, Iowa (95 miles north of Des Moines, IA, 170 miles south of Minneapolis, MN)

Description: We are looking for a hardworking, creative, farm assistant/employee that can help us grow our business. We are interested in hiring a young person who wants to farm independently in the future, but realizes the need to further develop their skills, first. We desire a working relationship with our assistant/intern of one or more years, both to benefit us and allow us more time to positively influence and share information with a future farmer. Our farm enterprises are corn, soybeans, small grains, hay, and beef cattle. We are certified organic, use long-term rotations, cover crops, managed grazing, ridge tillage, and no-till. We sell organic grain to wholesale buyers. Organic seed soybeans, oats, rye, hairy vetch and an occasional buckwheat crop are contracted with seed companies. Hay is not sold, but fed on the farm. Calves are sold through commodity markets or directly to other farmers for finishing.
