Departmental Scholars are the outstanding undergraduate degree candidates in an academic major as determined by the faculty in the major department. These candidates wear a gold medallion on a sapphire blue ribbon.

ACADEMIC DISTINCTION

Candidates for the baccalaureate degree, who have earned a minimum 60 semester hours of graded courses at Western, are eligible for graduation with academic distinction. Coursework completed at WIU, and all transferable hours, are calculated to determine honors. The academic distinction of Cum Laude is awarded to students with a grade point average of 3.60-3.74 on a 4.00 scale. These candidates wear a silver medallion on a gold ribbon. The academic distinction of Magna Cum Laude is awarded to students with a grade point average of 3.75-3.89. These candidates wear a silver medallion on a purple ribbon. The academic distinction of Summa Cum Laude is awarded to students with a grade point average of 3.90 or higher. These candidates wear a silver medallion on a red ribbon.

ALUMNI ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENTS

Bierman, a 2003 MBA finance and supply chain management and 1997 computer science graduate, was named vice president for business affairs at Eastern Illinois University in July 2022. Previously, he was the Chief Financial Officer at Illinois Wesleyan University, from 2018–2022. Bierman started his career at Western in 1999, serving as the Bayliss–Henninger complex director, and then moved to the director of residential facilities for University

Housing and Dining Services in 2006, serving in that role for six years. He was named interim budget director in 2011, before being named to the permanent position in 2012. He was appointed interim vice president for administrative services in January 2016 and permanent VP in May 2017.

During his time at WIU, in addition to leading residential facilities, the budget office and administrative services, he served as the St. Louis Rams Summer Training Camp coordinator at WIU, as an instructor for the

College Student Personnel program and as past president of GLACUHO (Great Lakes Association of College and University Housing Officers). Bierman was named the 2015 Executive in Residence for the WIU College of Business and Technology (CBT). He also was a member of the Macomb Community Unit School District No. 185 Board and the Macomb Chamber of Commerce Legislative Committee.

While an undergraduate at WIU, Bierman was a resident assistant and was a member of the Student Government Association, Inter-Hall Council, the National Residence Hall Honorary and the National Association of College and University Residence Halls. He also served as treasurer of the Management Information Systems Association, as a cooperative student at NTN Bower and as a member of the Student Leadership and Development Board, the Student Orientation Team and Student Orientation Staff.

Rutledge, a 1972 elementary education graduate, has served as a partner with District Leadership Solutions since 2017, and is also the sustainability coordinator at the Regional Office of Education #17, a position she has held since 2018. Previously, Rutledge was the executive director of the Large Unit District Association, and also served in a variety of administrative roles since 1979, including superintendent, serving for five years with the Springfield School District, as assistant superintendent of schools, principal and assistant principal. Rutledge began her career as a teacher in 1972, at Dubois Elementary School.

Rutledge has received numerous excellence in education awards and women in leadership awards for her work in education and within her communities, including the recent 2022

Athena Leadership Award for her professional excellence, community service and assisting women in reaching professional excellence. In her community, she is the former chair of the Memorial Health System Board of Directors, and has served on numerous boards and organizations in the Springfield (IL) region.

While at WIU, she was involved in the elementary education

department and Bennett Hall activities. Rutledge has been very supportive of her alma mater over the years with contributions to scholarships and the Curriculum and Instruction department. She is currently working with the School of Nursing to help develop a pipeline of nurses between WIU and Memorial Health System in Springfield.

ALUMNI ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENTS (CONTINUED)

Sanders, a 1974 business graduate, is a senior major gifts officer for the global non-profit Lutheran Hour Ministries and a consultant for American Solutions for Business, both in St. Louis (MO). Following his graduation from Western, Sanders has had a successful career in sales and business development. He began his career with Moore Business Forms, prior to founding the full-service marketing company, SWM, Inc. in 1981. His firm was recognized

locally and nationally, receiving the St. Louis Small Business Award by the St. Louis Business Journal and attaining INC 500 status as one of the Fastest Growing Companies in America, and #1 in Missouri in 1987. Sanders sold SWM in 2006, but has continued to work as a business consultant focusing on integrating marketing and technology solutions for private, public and non-profit organizations on a regional and national level.

Sanders was a four-year starter and captain of the WIU Soccer Team. The All-Time leading scorer when he finished his soccer career, he was one of the youngest Leatherneck athletes, and one of the

first soccer players, inducted into the Western Illinois Athletics Hall of Fame (1988). Sanders was also one of the leaders of the fundraising campaign to construct a new field, which was named after famed WIU Soccer Coach John Mackenzie. Sanders was a member of the WIU Alumni Council for 13 years, including a term as president from 2018-2020, during which he led the council and Alumni Association through a challenging time in WIU's history. Sanders' leadership

was instrumental in laying the foundation for the success that Western enjoys today. He and his wife, Kathie (WIU '74), are longtime members of the Leatherneck Club, and he is a frequent presenter for WIU business classes.

Sanders has served in leadership positions with the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, Autism Speaks, The Backstoppers, The Adoption Exchange and more. He has coached youth baseball teams over the years, and was inducted into the St. Louis Soccer Hall of Fame in 2011.

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY LECTURER DR. JULIA ALBARRACÍN

Julia Albarracín, professor of Political Science, earned her Doctorate (2004) in Political Science from the University of Florida and master's degree (1997) in International Business from the universities of Belgrano and Ecole des Pont (Paris Tech). She received her Law Degree from the University of La Plata School of Law and Social Sciences (1989).

Dr. Albarracín joined Western's faculty in 2005 as an assistant professor. She was promoted to professor in Political Science in 2014.

Dr. Albarracín was the recipient of the Student Services Act of Kindness Award in 2019, from Western Illinois University; the President's Award for Excellence in Leadership in 2018; received the Provost's Award in Excellence in Internationalizing the Campus in 2016, as well as the College of Arts and Sciences Award for Internationalizing the Campus; named the Dan and Laura Webb Professor of Political Science 2015 - 2018, and was an inductee in the Eta Epsilon Chapter of Phi Beta Delta. The purpose of the Eta Epsilon chapter is to recognize and encourage high professional, intellectual, academic, and personal achievements in the field of international education. In 2020, she was a recipient of the Community Research + Partnership program award through the Illinois Maya Initiative from the University of Illinois, and, in 2019, she was a recipient of the Migration and Refugees in Regional and Global Perspectives Initiative award for the project "Evaluating needs and improving support for Q'anjob'al and other Indigenous Latin American groups in C-U." Albarracín was the recipient of several research grants from Western Illinois University, the University of Florida, the National Science Foundation and the Tinker Foundation; and was a recipient of the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean Fellowship. Her book, "At the Core and in the Margins: The Incorporation of Mexican Immigrants in two Rural Midwestern Communities," was nominated by Casa de Las Americas for its prestigious Latino Studies Award.

Dr. Albarracín has served as a pre-law advisor, as well as serving on numerous department,

committees, including the
Higher Values in Higher
Education Committee,
President's Executive Institute,
Difficult Conversations
Steering Committee,
International Education Week
Committee, Presidential
Search Committee, Academic
Program Elimination Review
(APER), and is a member of
Faculty Senate. Her community
work includes serving on the
Equal Opportunity and Fair

Housing Commission for the city of Macomb, as a member of the League of Women Voters of McDonough County, consultant for the creation of the Champaign Urbana Public Health District Immigrant Welcome Center, Community Navigator for Immigration Project, and executive director of the immigrant services organization Western Illinois DREAMers. Dr. Albarracín established the WIU DREAMers Scholarship Fund to provide the opportunity for undocumented students to attend Western Illinois University.

Dr. Albarracín has authored and published numerous chapters in books and articles in peer-reviewed journals that have appeared in Aids and Behavior, Aids Care, American Journal of Applied Social Psychology, Dialogos and the Hispanic Journal of Behavioral Sciences on a diversity of issues related to Latinx and immigrant communities, including HIV prevention, health coverage, language acquisition and political participation. Her book "Making Immigrants in Modern Argentina," was published in 2020. Throughout her career, Albarracín has presented her research at many scholarly conferences and meetings.

New York University Press will publish her fourth book, "Deferred Action: The Roller Coaster Incorporation of DACA Recipients."

The 2022 Distinguished Faculty Lecture is titled, "Creating Conspiracy Beliefs: How our Thoughts are Shaped" is based on her 2021 book (coauthored with Dolores Albarracín, Sally Chan and Kathleen Jamieson) of the same name, published by Cambridge University Press.

THE WESTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of university scholarship and integrity since the 11th century, is used to lead the academic procession at commencement and other special ceremonial occasions, signifying the importance of the event and the confirmation of the academic process.

The University's mace was designed by WIU Department of Art Chair Kat Myers, and crafted by Myers in collaboration with the late Kenneth B. Epperson, Western alumnus and former WIU Admissions' community college director.

The turned walnut shaft is encircled by three engraved sterling silver bands with four pierced sterling silver fins cradling a freely moving gold sphere. The fins represent Western Illinois
University's four core values—Academic
Excellence, Educational Opportunity,
Personal Growth, and Social
Responsibility—positioned as the four
directions of the compass. The sphere,
representing the student, is held and
guided by the fins as it moves to find its
place in the world.

The incorporated sphere was formed by raising, a 3,000-year-old metalsmithing process, using steel hammers and forms to shape sheet metal. The sphere is made of 24K gold-plated brass. While the process was chosen as a representation of Western's respect for tradition, the sphere remains mobile, illustrating the University's readiness to adapt as it looks toward an ever-changing future.

ABOUT THE FLAGS

Displayed in the arena are the flags of 11 nations representing students in today's graduating class at Western Illinois University. The flags represent the following countries: Bangladesh, Canada, Ghana, India, Ivory Coast, Mexico, Nigeria, Pakistan, Philippines, Saudi Arabia, and Senegal. Western Illinois University was home to students from 59 countries during the Fall 2022 semester.

ABOUT THE GONFALONS

Gonfalons made their inaugural appearance in Western's Fall 2009 Commencement ceremonies. The gonfalons are banners hung from a crossbar on poles, which represent the specific group immediately following the gonfalonier, the person carrying the banner.

Their origins date back to medieval Italy, when gonfalons were used to distinguish Italian republics. They have also been used in ecclesiastical processions, as well as in war; and they have evolved into bearing coats of arms for individuals and groups.

Many universities and colleges have adopted the use of gonfalons to enhance the ceremonial nature of commencement exercises.

Today's processionals include gonfalons for Western Illinois University, the School of Graduate Studies, and each of the four academic colleges: Arts and Sciences; Business and Technology; Education and Human Services; and Fine Arts and Communication as well as the Centennial Honors College, and University Libraries.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The colorful regalia worn by academicians is steeped in tradition, dating back to the ecclesiastical garb of the Middle Ages. Adaptations from ecclesiastical to academic dress began in early European universities, which were founded by the church. University faculty and students wore the adapted robes for distinction and warmth. The University of Cambridge is cited as the first to use the academic gown.

Representatives of American universities met in the early 1890s and agreed upon a standard style of academic attire. The Intercollegiate Code, revised in 1932, and again in 1959, is followed today by American colleges and universities, except for a few schools, which continue to use the styles of England.

Gowns are traditionally black. However, some universities have authorized use of a color symbolic of the institution. Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are designed to be worn closed. Master's and Specialist gowns have long, closed sleeves with an arc near the bottom and an opening for the arm. Doctoral gowns are faced with wide velvet panels and have bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal velvet bars.

Caps, originally round, are typically square mortarboards. Some universities have adopted a doctor's cap with a soft crown instead of the mortarboard.

ACADEMIC REGALIA (CONTINUED)

At Western, the tassel color of bachelor degree candidates indicates the college or program from which students graduate: College of Arts and Sciences, white for bachelor of arts, gold for bachelor of science, white and gold for bachelor of liberal arts and sciences, and apricot for bachelor of science in nursing; College of Business and Technology, sapphire blue; College of Education and Human Services, light blue for bachelor of science and bachelor of science in education, and citron for bachelor of social work; College of Fine Arts and Communication, brown for bachelor of arts, bachelor of fine arts, and bachelor of science, and pink for bachelor of music; General Studies Degree Program, white for bachelor of arts; and Interdisciplinary Studies, white for bachelor of arts and gold for bachelor of science. Master's tassels are black. Doctoral tassels are old gold.

Hoods, which originally were attached to the gown and could be slipped over the head for warmth, are the most colorful articles of specialist, master's, and doctor's clothing. The color of the lining of the hood represents the university awarding the degree. The color of the facing of the hood reflects the academic discipline of the wearer's highest degree. At Western, the colors awarded for doctoral and graduate degrees are: light blue, education doctorate, education specialist, and master of science in education; gold, specialist in school psychology and master of science; sapphire blue, master of accountancy and master of business administration; white, master of arts; white and gold, master of liberal arts and sciences; pink, master of music; and brown, master of fine arts.

Colors which may be seen among the marching faculty and their corresponding fields of study include: brown (fine arts), crimson (journalism), dark blue (philosophy), golden yellow (science), lemon yellow (library science), light blue (education), yellow brown (commerce, business, accountancy), pink (music), purple (law), sage green (physical education), scarlet (theology), gold and white (liberal arts and sciences), and white (arts, letters, humanities).

Information for Degree Candidates

Undergraduate and graduate students are eligible to participate in Commencement if they anticipate completion of requirements for graduation during the fall semester.

The roster of candidates listed in this program is a compilation of those eligible to participate and who have not submitted the Exclusion of Directory Information Form. It should not be construed either as a complete or official list of those who will receive a University degree. Due to publishing deadlines, names of some degree recipients may not appear, while names of degree candidates may appear even though they have not completed their degree requirements.

Honors distinctions are based on the candidate's academic record at the time of publication.

Diplomas will be mailed approximately eight weeks after Commencement to those who have completed requirements and have no University encumbrances.

The University has arranged for a professional photographer to take individual photographs as students cross the stage. Order forms and proofs will be mailed to the diploma address. DVDs of each ceremony will also be available through this mailing.

The University's official registry for conferral of degrees is the Office of the Registrar, 1 University Circle, Macomb, IL 61455-1390.

Disability parking and seating are available at Western Hall. Assistive listening devices are available at the north lobby information table in Western Hall. Sign language interpretation is also provided. Mobility devices provided by Western are not permitted outside Western Hall.

A public first aid station in Western Hall is located in the east-west hallway behind the lower seating level on the south side.

Please note all emergency exit locations. Emergency exits in Western Hall are located behind the stage at the west end of the gym, through the East Arena, and through the main entry at the north lobby doors.

HISTORY OF WESTERN

On April 24, 1899, a bill to establish Western Illinois University (then called Western Illinois State Normal School) was passed by the state legislature. Macomb was selected in 1900 as the location for the new normal school in west central Illinois, and on Tuesday, Sept. 23, 1902, Western Illinois State Normal School opened its doors for the first official day of classes on the new campus.

In 1921, the General Assembly changed the name of Western Illinois State Normal School to Western Illinois State Teachers College, and in 1947, the school was renamed Western Illinois State College. Ten years later, the school became Western Illinois University. Illinois Gov. William G. Stratton approved the change July 5, 1957, and Western began its transformation into a university.

Today, Western offers numerous undergraduate and graduate degree programs, as well as two doctoral programs and several post-baccalaureate certificate programs, and is comprised of the main campus in Macomb, IL, and an urban campus in Moline, IL.
