Vivian Teaching Scholars will teach three courses (graduate students completing their degree) and/or teach a traditional faculty load (current academic professionals) during an academic year. Participants will continue to conduct research, and contribute to the University community.

## **Requirements:**

#### **REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

- 1) Eligibility to work in the United States.
- 2) A member of a diverse cultural or ethnic group that is typically underrepresented among U.S. higher education faculty. We particularly encourage applications from individuals who identify as BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and People of Color), or Latinx.







3) Current enrollment or recently completed terminal degree program (Ph.D., Ed.D., MFA, etc.) in Anthropology, Clinical Psychology, Cognitive/Forensic Psychology, English, Library and Information Studies, or Theatre (Performance).

For a degree to be considered, it must be conferred from a regionally accredited, degree-granting institution of higher education (or equivalent from an international accrediting body).

#### **Additional Information:**

THE PROGRAM: In honor of the Rev. Dr. C.T. Vivian, a distinguished and accomplished Western Illinois University alumnus who made monumental contributions to society as a pivotal leader, activist and organizer in the Civil Rights Movement, WIU is extending teaching opportunities to graduate students and current academic professionals pursuing careers as university faculty, who are entering the final year of a terminal degree or doctoral program, or have just completed a terminal degree or doctoral program. C.T. Vivian Teaching Scholars will teach three courses (graduate students completing their degree), or teach a traditional faculty load (current academic professionals) during an academic year. Participants will continue to conduct research, and contribute to the University community.

The C.T. Vivian Teaching Scholars Program is designed to provide professional teaching experiences, mentoring and training, and potential tenure-track employment opportunities within WIU academic departments and schools.

THE UNIVERSITY: Since 1902, Western Illinois University has provided outstanding educational opportunities to individuals in west central Illinois and well beyond our region and state. WIU's traditional residential campus in Macomb, IL, is the educational, cultural and athletic center of the region, while the WIU-Quad Cities non-residential branch campus, in Moline, IL, is the only public university in the immediate Quad Cities region.

Western is a comprehensive university offering 61 undergraduate, 40 graduate degree programs and two doctoral degrees. With a student-to-faculty ratio of 13:1, the University's 423 full-time faculty members teach 95% of all undergraduate and graduate courses.

WIU-Macomb, IL: A traditional, residential four-year campus with distinctive undergraduate degrees and numerous graduate programs, including a doctorate in education, WIU-Macomb is located in the heart of west central Illinois in Macomb (population 16,000). Macomb is an Amtrak city with twice-daily service to Chicago.

WIU-Quad Cities: The only public university in the Quad Cities area, WIU-QC offers select undergraduate and graduate programs, including a doctorate in education and a doctorate in environmental studies, at its non-residential campus in Moline, IL (population 44,000).

WIU's Macomb campus is the educational, cultural and athletic center of the region. Annually, 12 major theatrical and dance productions and studio shows are performed, along with outstanding concerts, lectures, presentations, films, dance performances and





more. The Gwendolyn Brooks and Casa Latina cultural centers offer programs and activities focusing on Black and Hispanic cultures, while the Women's Center promotes gender equity through education, support and advocacy. WIU's student organization for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer/questioning and ally (LGBTQ\*A) community provides resources, support and programming. These cultural and resource centers promote WIU's goal of enhancing diversity, equity and inclusion through educational programming and advocacy.

The University's athletics program, based on the Macomb campus, sponsors 19 NCAA Division I intercollegiate men's and women's varsity sports. Football competes in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision through the Missouri Valley Football Conference; all other varsity sports compete at the Division I level through The Summit League.

- 1) A letter of interest/application, including teaching philosophy
- 2) Current curriculum vitae or resume
- 3) The names, telephone numbers, and e-mail addresses of three - five current professional references
- 4) A separate statement regarding your commitment to and experience of, diversity, equity and inclusion
- 5) Unofficial transcripts

Additional application materials should include:

- Proposed plan for completion of terminal degree or second master's degree\* (\*the latter applies to Library and Information Studies only)
- Abstract of dissertation or thesis (if applicable)
- Proposed timeline for dissertation completion or thesis
